

ETC-1 *Imminent Danger of a Human* on Roadway or Shoulder
EMERGENCY TRAFFIC CONTROL (ETC)

This document is meant to provide guidance for employees who come upon a human in imminent danger on the roadway or shoulder. Employees are expected to call 911 for emergency services. Stopping is optional.

This ETC is not for planned work. For planned work, use appropriate Typical Applications.

A human is in imminent danger if the human is on the roadway without any other protective vehicle or traffic control devices, and serious injury or death will occur if the human is not immediately removed.



This ETC is not for every situation. Employee judgment must be used when determining whether a human is in imminent danger and when responding.

Upon arrival:

- 1) Activate fleet lighting.
- 2) Position the vehicle in advance of the incident space. Be aware of roll-ahead space when positioning the vehicle and when choosing an escape area.
- 3) Turn front wheels away from incident space/escape area.
- 4) Exit the vehicle and proceed to the incident space or an escape area. Employees must wear the appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) when out of the vehicle.

If parked on the roadway, occupants are not to remain in the vehicle unless it is an Emergency Response Vehicle or it is equipped with a truck-mounted attenuator.
